Where Do You Live????

A man who resided near the border of two states had been told for years his house was in Minnesota. But when a new survey revealed that **he actually lived in Wisconsin**, he proclaimed, **"Thank goodness! I never could bear those cold Minnesota winters."**

Defining where we live certainly affects our attitude. Followers



of Jesus, or saints, consider their true home to be in God's dynamic presence. St. Paul was so connected to God through prayer that mystical experiences left him not knowing whether he was in or out of his body (see 2 Corinthians 12:1-10). Living with one foot in heaven and the other on the way there, Paul could know peace. "Whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's," he concludes (Romans

14:8). Christian saints who are still living on earth can rest assured: Our true home is always with the Lord.



Yesterday, I was walking down by the Little Sugar River and I noticed something that looked like tomatoes on a plant in the woods. My mind began going through all the catalogs in my mental database, "**HMMM, what could these be?**" After looking closer I saw that they were in fact on a tomato vine which was long and leggy, I guess to reach above the brush and cover around it. On it were about 5 golf ball sized tomatoes that were green as green could be. How in the world did that seed, which grew that plant, get all the way down there? What are the odds that **that seed** would grow in among all that brush and yet here it was.

Plants are some of the most amazing beings on this planet. As they drink in the carbon, they are key to controlling our atmosphere and also the basis for all our food. You know, we either eat plants or eat animals that eat plants. They breathe in what we breathe out and, more importantly, we breathe in what they breathe out - **FILTERED OXYGEN!** Such amazing beings! But for me, it is this business of how they reproduce that boggles my mind. One would think that plants can't move, and yet, things like my friend the tomato happen every day!

Birds eat fruits and carry seed far from the parent plant and carelessly plant them with a bit of fertilizer. Beggar's ticks, burrs, and thistles latch on to animals walking by and travel far from



the point they began! Winds pick up seeds like the milkweed and dandelion and scatter them. I laugh when I watch the antics of the squirrels in my yard carrying acorns and walnuts to bury them far from the mother tree! I see thousands of pounds of farm equipment working far into the night gathering seeds which will be made into feed or even perhaps seeds for next year's crop!

Seeds are an amazing thing. They just seem to pass us by in their little world while we deal with more important things, well, more important to us at least.

Today I think about the parable of the Sower in Matthew 13:3b-8. Jesus tells of a Sower and all the perils that may befall seed

and only certain ones produce! The farmer knows he must seed heavily. He also knows that each and every one of them is a seed of hope, a chance for success. The King James Version talks about the seed finding



purchase. I love that word purchase - as if there is some sense of investment, a chance, a chance at hope by the famer that his seed will grow!

May our deeds flow from us each and every day. May our words be spoken with love and care. May we plant these seeds of love with wild abandon. May we see some of our efforts flourish and have understanding that some may just bloom over in the weeds! May we plant love with the hope of a great harvest!
