Lighting The Way For Others

When Ida Nelson, head tribal clerk of a remote Alaskan village, heard an airplane flying low after dark, she knew something was wrong. Igiugig (Igggy-yaw-gigg), population 70, isn't normally a nighttime destination. Indeed, the medevac flight was coming to pick up a sick child.

Because the local airstrip's lights had been vandalized, the plane was having trouble landing. Nelson began alerting neighbors, and within minutes, villagers lined the runway with their vehicles, headlights blazing. The pilot was able to land and then safely deliver the sick child to an Anchorage hospital. The airlift service praised the residents' determination, but Nelson describes their effort as "normal" and "ordinary."

What everyday actions can you use to provide light amid darkness? How can you shine Jesus' light in a world that needs him?

As promised last month, we have another educational article about our budget and what it takes to keep this Church up and running.

Learning Session #2 Did you know???

Our largest expense is labor and benefits. It takes people to keep our Church building functioning, to keep connected, to provide programming and services to our members and our community, and to keep track of our finances. Here are the positions we have on staff and most are less than part-time or event based funded:

- *Salary Expense for all the above is \$121,185. Benefit Expenses total \$66,420.

What makes up Benefit Expenses you ask? Pension, Life/ Disability/Medical/Dental Insurances, Mileage, SECA, FICA, Medicare, and Continuing Education.

Church Cancellation Policy

On various occasions it may be necessary to cancel Sunday morning activities of the Church (Worship and Sunday School). Such cancellations will generally be the result of weather conditions including heavy snowfall (often with associated high winds), extreme cold, or icy road conditions.

- The Congregation President in consultation with the Pastor – will be responsible.
- 2 The decision to cancel will be made by 6:45 A.M. on Sunday morning.
- 3. Either the Pastor or the Congregation President will notify the local radio station (WEKZ) and Channel 15 to make a public announcement regarding the cancellation.

Guidelines regarding a decision to cancel:

Heavy blowing and blinding snow (whiteout conditions).

Extremely icy roads, Parking Lot, or walkways.

A wind chill warning. Any announcement by the National Weather Bureau deeming conditions to be hazardous.


ORGANISTS/PIANISTS who can play piano or organ proficiently for our Sunday morning services and other special events. This is a paid per practice/event position.
