Five Kernels

The Plymouth Pilgrims celebrated the first Thanksgiving Day in fall 1621, but by the next May, their food supply was depleted. The harvest of 1622 was a failure, and the Pilgrims often lived for days on just a few kernels of corn.



Amid a drought in 1623, the people sought divine intervention. After praying for nine hours on a hot July day, they were blessed with a two-week rainfall. Edward Winslow wrote, "It was hard to say whether our withered corn or drooping affections were most quickened and revived." The Pilgrims never went hungry again.

Start a Thanksgiving tradition by placing five kernels of corn at each place setting. Point out a blessing that each kernel represents. For example:


1. God loves us.

- 2. God provides for all our needs.
- 3. God gives us friends, just as the Indians befriended the Pilgrims.
- 4. God hears and answers our prayers.
- 5. God is preparing a place for us in heaven.

Then have family members share five things for which they're grateful. *Happy Thanksgiving!!*

Message from the Altar Guild

Did you know that when we decorate the Church, we take into consideration the Liturgical Colors of the Church? We have a calendar that we follow closely to coincide with the scriptures that are part of our Worship Services and the Liturgical Seasons. The majority of the year our colors are green during what is referred to as the Time of the Church or Ordi**nary Time**. You will notice that we try to use various shades of green as the base and complement with different colors according to the season. For example, for the summer we used sage green with some summer florals. For the fall we are using a darker green accented with orange, yellow, and brown. For Advent Season, which begins on December 3rd this year, the colors are blue and purple. We tend to use a bit more purple, since that is the color of our Advent altar cloths. However, we have also started to add in the color blue in our color palette. For Christmas, the colors are white and gold. **Christmas Season** lasts for about a month after December 25th. For Lent, the Liturgical Color is purple. We tend to accent the purple with blacks and grays and earthy tones to represent penance, sacrifice, and preparation. On Easter, the Liturgical Colors are white and gold. We tend to accent these colors with spring florals to represent rebirth, joy, and glory. The Liturgical Color for Pentecost is red. We typically use red accented with yellow and orange to help us represent fire. If you have questions about the Liturgical Colors and Seasons and our schedule, please do not hesitate to ask us. See the color wheel.



Over the years, Zwingli has accumulated many banners that were lovingly made by parishioners. It has been at least two decades since there have been any new banners made, with the majority being well over 30-40 years old. Many of our banners were made of materials that do not stand up well to time. (Materials such as felt, burlap, and other materials that fade, pill, unravel, and tear easily.) While we would love to use them, many of them are in poor condition after years of use and inappropriate storage. During the past year, Cindy Lederman, from the Altar Guild, has spent many hours restoring a few so that we can use them again. Some attempts have been more successful than others. We always welcome new banners, so if you are interested in developing a new one or restoring or refurbishing one or more of the old ones,

> please let us know. There are many sewing patterns for making banners on platforms like Pinterest.

Since many of the banners that Altar Guilds of the past depended on are old and in poor condition, we have been using quilts a bit more in our decorating. We appreciate the feedback we have been getting about the beautiful quilts that we hang in the East Entrance of the Church. We have some very talented people in our midst. Look for a few new ones to adorn our Sanctuary walls in the coming months. If you have a quilt that you would like to share with the Church, please contact Cindy or Barb. We carefully hang them with drapery hooks on a reinforced pole, so that they are protected. They are high enough that they do not get handled frequently, and they do not get direct sunlight. We typically hang them for 6-8 weeks at a time. Specifically, we are looking for a quilt to hang in the East Entrance during Advent Season (December 1 – 27). If you have a Christmas quilt you would like to share, please contact Barb (PH: 608-558-4458; email: blduerst4@gmail.com). And if you have a guilt that has the colors of one of our Liturgical Seasons you would like to share, we would love to borrow it as well.

Our Altar Guild is currently pretty small, so we would also welcome new volunteers to help us keep our worship space decorated beautifully throughout the year. Please reach out to one of us.

and will be using the Church Library beginning the first Thursday in November. If the Library is already reserved, they will be using their back-up site, the North Room area.








Christmas is coming up fast which means so is the
