CROSS OF ASHES



On Ash Wednesday, as Lent begins, worshipers' foreheads are often marked with ashes in the sign of the cross. The ashes traditionally come from burning palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. In the Old Testament, ashes were a sign of mourn-

ing and repentance. Today, some worshipers wipe off the ashes before leaving Church, to symbolize being cleansed from sin by Jesus' death; others wear the ashes the rest of the day, carrying the cross of Christ into the world. Reciting Genesis 3:19 often accompanies the placement of ashes: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return.

Thinking Out Loud

James Finley, one of my teachers from my sabbatical said, "Why do I live on the outer circumference of the inner depth that is my life?"

I think this is an excellent question. Lent is a season for deep reflection. How is it that I sabotage myself from experiencing the depth of my life? I think that this is part of the human condition and why we need to be intentional about our life in the Spirit.

My goal for my life is to show up for it. I find myself sleep walking through life and not even paying attention to the beauty and wonder that it is to be alive. How often do we say *TGIF*? Is it bad when, culturally, we say it is okay to not live most of the week and the weekend is the only time that it is worth experiencing? Then we go out and self medicate...then we can't remember how much fun we just had. It is challenging to show up for life.

I think that the spiritual journey is not a journey up to heaven, but a journey down into the depths of my own life and experience. This is a journey of **LETTING GO**. The scriptures for Lent have lines like.

"For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life . . .will save it" (Mark 8:35) or "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit" (John 12:24).

The journey of radical transformation that Jesus is pointing to is a journey down into the depth of life, into the depth of our experience. It is a journey of letting go. Letting go of the *ME* centered life. Letting go of who we think we are. Letting go of the need to be right. Letting go of the need to be successful. Letting go of the need to be in control. Letting go into Jesus and God.

Do we get frightened staring into the depth of our life? In my experience, looking into the depth of life looks an awful lot like staring into nothing, darkness, emptiness, void. When I really experience life . . .it's not all shimmery and bright with angels

singing in the background saying, "Don't be afraid!" But in fact, it is pretty . . . I don't know . . . normal and maybe even boring. What do we do when we experience this normal or boring experience of life? Do we run from it or embrace it? I believe that when we experience that darkness, that emptiness, and boredom, what we are experiencing is infinite expanse of LOVE. Since it is infinite, we don't have a reference point for it, so it is difficult to hold on to it. So our experience is darkness. St. John of the Cross says that this darkness is in fact an infinite light, which is God. When we are in a dark room and we open the blinds really fast, the light can be so intense that the room appears dark. The light of God is so bright that it seems dark. And it is infinite that we have no way of perceiving it with our normal senses. So the infinite love that we call God is experienced as darkness and emptiness. This can be frightening and hard to stare into and might make us try to distract ourselves from this reality.

Search Committee Updates

Happy New Year!

Starting off the New Year is a good time to update everyone on our search for a new Pastor. As you know, we have been providing periodic updates during the Church Service throughout the early months of this process. This is a good time to update everyone and all those who are unable to hear those announcements during the Church Service.

One of the comments that I have been asked is, "Why is this process taking so long?" and "Why don't we have a Pastor by now?" These are great questions and it is important to remind everyone that the committee must follow a process that is in place from our UCC Conference. We started this process in May and we have just finished the first leg of this journey with the community and membership surveys. The process included: developing those surveys, getting them out to the different groups and the membership, allowing for return time, and then compiling all the information. We were still receiving surveys in December, but are now compiling all your information, ideas, concerns, suggestions, and vision which the committee will review. We received back about 30% of the surveys. Thank you to everyone who returned their survey, we appreciate your responses. This information will assist the committee in moving into the next phase of this process which is writing the Church Profile.

The Church Profile was revised, by the UCC Conference, and is a very detailed document requiring much more information from the Church and congregation than in the past, to reflect the future vision of this Church and draw together pastoral candidates interested in applying for the position here at Zwingli. Once the profile has been completed and sent into the UCC Conference, interested candidates' profiles will be



reviewed, referenced, and background checks completed, interviews conducted, sermon tapes reviewed, etc. The time this process takes will be determined based on the number of applicants the committee receives.

Once a small number of candidates is selected, the committee will prayerfully select final candidates to present to the congregation for a final vote.

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact anyone on the Search Committee: Deb Broge, Chairman; Doc Davis, Dave Gietzel, Denise Pinnow, Cindi Ritter, and Paul Rieder.

We will continue to do our best to move this process along keeping the vision of Zwingli UCC at the forefront in the selection of a new Pastor and provide updates as we can. The committee thanks you for your support and patience as we prayerfully move through this process. We continue to ask for your prayers and, with God's guidance, we will be blessed with a wonderful new Pastor to guide us as we

"Your call may not be to change anything in your life other than your perspective," Paintner concludes. That provided newfound freedom. Of course, our good Savior — whose burden is light — will help us navigate decisions and commitments. The only takeaway may be a much-needed shift in our perspective.

Church Cancellation Policy

On various occasions it may be necessary to cancel Sunday morning activities of the Church (Worship and Sunday School). Such cancellations will generally be the result of weather conditions including heavy snowfall (often with associated high winds), extreme cold, or icy road conditions.

- The Congregation President in consultation with the Pastor – will be responsible.
- **2.** The decision to cancel will be made by 6:45 A.M. on Sunday morning.
- 3. Either the Pastor or the Congregation President will notify the local radio station (WEKZ) and Channel 15 to make a public announcement regarding the cancellation.

Guidelines regarding a decision to cancel:

Heavy blowing and blinding snow (whiteout conditions).

Extremely icy roads, Parking Lot, or walkways.

A wind chill warning. Any announcement by the National Weather Bureau deeming conditions to be hazardous.
