

Message from the Caring Ministry

We are still mourning the loss of our Caring Ministries Coordinator, Cindi Ritter, who lost her battle with cancer on May 15, 2025. At the May Consistory meeting, I was appointed as the Interim Caring Ministries Coordinator as a stop gap measure to keep things moving along until we can determine our Church community's needs for the future, keeping in mind that we will soon (hopefully) be having a new Pastor joining us. Our Zwingli Caring Ministry is not only about its coordinator. We have a cadre of volunteers who are helping to reach out to members of our community. As I am learning about all of these things, I thought I would share some of them with you.

- **Prayer Chain:** I send out a weekly Prayer Chain email to 21 people on a weekly basis. We only include people on the Prayer Chain with their permission. There are also a few additional people who are on a Prayer Chain who do not use email. They receive a weekly printout of the email.
- **CD Distribution:** Volunteers regularly deliver worship service CDs to four people.
- **Birthday/Anniversary Cards:** Cinda Field sends birthday and anniversary cards to all of our members on behalf of Zwingli. In May, she sent 20 birthday cards and 5 anniversary cards. The Sunshine Team also reports sending birthday and anniversary cards, since birthdays are listed in the "*Chimes*" each month.
- **Visits:** There is a four-person visiting team consisting of Carol Schultz, Deb Broge, Kris Zanoya, and Gloria Godfrey.
 - In May 2025, there were 11 visits and one ride to a medical appointment.
 - In April 2025, there were 38 visits. The number was higher because visitors distributed Spring Care Packages.

- The four members of the visiting team also make phone calls and send out cards. Carol Schultz puts together a monthly calendar with inspirational sayings and Bible verses. She distributes this to 13 people every month.
- Sunshine Team: There is a 25 person Sunshine Team that sends out cards, makes visits, or phone calls to people on a list updated quarterly. These include people in nursing homes and assisted living facilities as well as those who are confined at home or having some recent challenges (death in the past year, recent or chronic illness, etc.). The numbers reported here are likely underrepresented since not everyone on the Sunshine Team list submits an activity report.
 - In May 2025, 30 cards were sent by the Sunshine Team beyond those sent by Cinda. About half of the cards that were reported were birthday and anniversary cards.
 - In April 2025, 38 cards were sent by the Sunshine Team members. Many of these cards were Easterrelated.
 - In May 2025, there were eight phone calls placed to people on our Sunshine list, there were none recorded in April.
- We offer the Sunshine Team the option of using cards that we have on hand, and we have many cards available in the Caring Ministry Coordinator's Office for their use. Many of the cards have been made by Sally Disrud.

I am extremely grateful for the efforts of the Prayer Chain members, visiting team, and Sunshine Team for their efforts in connecting and sending joy and hope to our members. 

PREVENTING BLIND SPOTS

About 40% of any vehicle consists of blind spots, which are responsible for an estimated 800,000 accidents each year in the United States. People also have blind spots, and when they're spiritual, they can have tragic consequences.

Pastor Rick Warren suggests these steps for discovering and overcoming blind spots:



- Pray, asking God to remind you what is true about him and about you. "Point out anything in me that offends you, and lead me along the path of everlasting life" (Psalm 139:24, NLT).
- Ask some trusted Christian friends or family to point out things in you that you can't see. "Fools think their own way is right, but the wise listen to others" (Proverbs 12:15, NLT).
- Finally, ask Jesus to change you. The Bible says the truth will set you free (John 8:32), and Jesus calls himself the truth (John 14:6). So the closer you are to Jesus, the more he will fill you with the truth. As God's truth helps you see clearly, you'll be less vulnerable to self-deception.
